- 7. Idea for a travelling "elf." It would be a sign moving from class to class for stimulating ideas on what teachers want/need from the PTO. Will review it again at our next meeting.

Principal (Alissa Goguen):

1. Bus Driver appreciation breakfast was a huge success. The cards, waffle bar, and breakfast was greatly appreciated. The connection between the drivers and school was elevated. We would like to keep it going yearly on Bus Driver Appreciation Day in October.

2. Juvenile Diabetes Day – November 14th, Mrs. Burke has asked that we donate snacks for the children up to \$100.00. Voted on this support, an unanimously agreed. School will submit receipts to PTO.

Teacher Representative (Jill/Deb):

- 1. Deb shared a presentation on Project Oceanology. It is a curriculum within the 6th grade science program. Covid unfortunately put this trip on hold. This year it is back for the 6, 7, & 8th grades to go on the boat trip. In addition to Project O, we have been running the salmon school project in grades 3 and 6 for the last 8 years. They release their salmon into the Farmington River in the spring illustrating the connection from what we do and how our contribution makes it all the way to the Atlantic Ocean.
 - June 23rd All day event. Engaged in learning "hands on" Marine Science at the Long Island Sound.
 - Fees: \$ 350.00 for the Bus and the Pavilion Fee is \$50.00
 - Average cost per child is \$70.00.
 - Bus \$700.00
 - Project O \$2,305
 - In the past we have pledged a certain amount to bring the fee per child down. Goal would be to bring the price down to a \$50.00 (42 children x \$20.00). Voted unanimously to bring all down to \$50.00 per student.
- 2. Jill attended Performance Matters in Hartford. The push is how do we make the learning experience for the children more "Active." Vertical learning is idea we are going to try to implement. Asking the PTO for contribution for reimbursement for the 4 whiteboards to try this new interactive vertical learning idea. Each board was \$105. Voted on supporting reimbursement, it was a unanimous vote to reimburse on all 4 from the PTO funds.
