


Hartland Elementary School



Resolution of School Board Commitment to Student Achievement

- the board will devote meeting time to topics that directly support and enhance student learning success and the interests of our community.



Percentage for school construction projects.



HARTLAND BOARD OF EDUCATION

WHEREAS, special education costs are creating an increasing burden on local education budgets; and

WHEREAS, the HARTLAND Board of Education is committed to providing an appropriate educational opportunity for all students in the district; and

WHEREAS, there is a need for the state to fund a greater portion of costly special education placements; now

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the HARTLAND Board of Education respectfully requests that the Connecticut General Assembly provide state reimbursement for locally placed special education students under the excess cost program when the costs exceed three times the district's average per pupil expenditure.
